The Advanced CBRN Pharmacy Course (ACPC) is a new three-day course held at APG, MD, that emphasizes advanced pharmacological management of CBRN casualties with emphasis on prolonged care at Role II and Role III levels, medical-logistical management of CBRN casualties in large scale combat operations, and optimization of treatment to reduce long-term sequelae of CBRN injuries. Attendees learn about the latest research and clinical updates about an expanded range of CBRN threats, and practice hands-on skills in antidote preparation and resuscitation of critically ill casualties. This course is recommended for advanced practice clinical providers such as specialty physicians (medical toxicology, intensive care, occupational health, etc.), pharmacists, physician associates, advanced practice nurses, special operations medical personnel, and other medical professionals seeking more in-depth understanding of CBRN casualty treatment, both immediate and sustained.
